

#### The Importance of a Vessel Safety Check by Gary Vinzant, Safety Chairman

Last month, I received an email directed to the 10 closest VSC examiners (Coast Guard Auxiliary & USPS) from someone requesting a Vessel Safety Check. Usually one of the other examiners takes the inspection before I can respond. This time, one other responded to say he was out of state. I contacted the boater and the next Saturday I inspected his boat in his driveway in Elk Grove Village. He has a rugged 16 foot fishing boat with a 25hp outboard and a trolling motor.

He needed the inspection to satisfy a requirement of the Coast Guard. Last September, he was stopped by the Coast Guard in Kenosha. He had three violations – Registration – PFDs – Visual Distress Signals. He showed me a letter which stated he may have to pay fines of just over \$2,900 for each violation. The letter required him to purchase the required items, submit a picture of them and a copy of the receipts. It also required him to get and send a copy of a new Vessel Safety Check examination, which is why I was there.

He passed the inspection, although his (red/green) bow light was not so good. He said he didn't need the lights because he only fishes in the daytime. However, I told him they are required to be working and he would have to turn them on if there was fog.

As I was leaving he wanted to give me money. I told him we do this voluntarily – no need to pay. He was very insistent and I thought he gave me a \$10 bill. Later I discovered it was a \$100 bill. I spent the \$100 on Amazon and sent him a new bow light, a first aid kit, a set of dock lines and fisherman's pliers.



Skokie Valley has five metal sextants and one plastic sextant which we are offering to our members. All sextants are in good condition. However, we do not know when they were last calibrated. 



#### **Boating in South Florida by Stuart Zwang**

We have a modest condominium in Boca Raton, FL. I think that it is about 25 years old. When the kids were still in school, they knew what and where they were going during spring break. Now they are productive, tax paying adults. When our parents were still with us, we sent them there for the entire season. It was a win-win-win deal. We were good, respectful offspring. We had them out of our hair for the season. Someone looked after the condo and took care of all the maintenance while they were there.

We are still working in Chicago, and only have a limited time to visit this oasis. Fortunately we decided to go down to South Florida for the first month of 2024. That is when one of our vaunted polar vortexes hit Chicago. It was so cold that there were frost quakes. South Florida was cloudy and 'only' in the 60's. It was tough, but we took it.

Both our kids were smart enough to come down to visit us during this Chicago cold snap. In looking for an activity, we decided to rent a boat, and drive it up the inter-coastal waterway. We found a place in Pompano Beach called Intra Coastal Water Sports Inc. We were able to make a two hour reservation for a pontoon boat. The cost was \$300. Frankly this was a bargain, considering I think it costs me something like \$400 for a single hour to run my boat in Chicago.

When we got to their marina, we had to sign the obligatory waivers. I showed them my Power Squadron Instructor card and a copy of my Boat US Insurance card. They were totally unimpressed, but at least they did not quibble about any of the details regarding our operating or renting the boat.

The four of us boarded the boat. When my son-in-law even looks at water, he immediately gets seasick. Instead of boating with us, he stayed in our condo to watch the NFL football play-offs. He is from Philadelphia and the Eagles lost. He probably would have been happier and better off boating with us. The weather was mostly cloudy with a 20 mile an hour breeze coming from the North East. The temperature was a hair under 70 degrees Fahrenheit, but it was still a heck of a lot better than the snow storm that was hitting Chicago.

We got in a very nice (only) two year old pontoon boat and got on the Intercostal Water Way. We traveled north from Pompano. There was frankly a lot of traffic. At one time there were three boats headed south and two boats including ours headed north in parallel. Still there was plenty of room, and the boaters were quite polite. We were all able to drive our vessels without any problems.





South Florida is an interesting place. The automobile drivers are absolutely insane. As suggested above, the boat drivers were actually much better. They were respectful and did obey the rules of the road. When they wave at you, they



use their entire hand with all five fingers showing. This contrasts to car drivers who drive like maniacs, cut you off, tail gate, etc. They are also quite friendly, and wave at you. They, however, only use one finger in their wave. My big observation and criticism that I have regarding South Florida boat captains has to do with Boom Boats. Do you remember what a 'boom car' is? We actually encountered about three 'boom boats.'

My daughter asked me to compare our 23' open bow runabout to the 21' pontoon boat. It was an interesting question. The characteristics of the 100 horse power pontoon boat's engine were a bit difficult to get used to. It did not like changing gears, and there is a grinding on the transmission just before the boat goes into gear. Our boat handles a lot better and is both more powerful and more responsive. Those characteristics are less important on the inter-coastal where 95% of the water way is a 'no wake' zone. This is similar to the Florida governor who has made the entire state a 'no woke' zone.



As this is South Florida, we did have to avoid a number of coconuts in the water. When my kids were small, the one that whined the loudest had to carry the 'whining coconut' for an hour. It worked very well. We had a lot of fun. Along the way there were the obligatory restaurants and bars all along the shore. The two hours passed far too quickly. We docked at about four thirty PM. That was just in time for the 'early bird' dinner specials near our condo.

In addition to early bird specials, we find that the work ethic in South Florida is reflective of the infamous 'Manana' method of labor. Even our printer embraced this – it does not work very well but it does eat the paper and printer cartridges early and often. It takes several tries to get this equipment to work.

So, now the month of January is over. In Chicago I have to go back to reality. This includes work on my Masters' degree, while going back to our business of inspecting homes. Since the mortgage lending rates are relatively high, there is little inventory, nobody wants to pay these (seemingly) high rates, and the weather is prohibitive, Real Estate sales are quite slow. Instead we will work on a number of deferred home improvement projects.

Remember, no matter what type of property you own, you should expect to spend about 3% of the property value in repairs and maintenance. Our condo requires this work during the only month we are there. I have to do all of those repairs that have built up through the year. Consequently, I have become a 'frequent flyer' at the nearby Home Cheapo store. if you have a condominium, this percentage is also reflected in the overall Home Owner / Association fees.



Similarly, the boats in our area, require a percentage of their value to be put in as repairs. We try to do all the repairs and maintenance in the fall and spring before we put our boats in the water for the all too short summer boating season. Part of that percentage also applies to the bills for our boat's winter storage, oil change, minor repairs and the inout service in the spring. Still, it is part of the 'fun' and challenges of owning a boat in our area.

We are glad to be back in Chicago so we can visit with all of our Skokie Valley buddies at our meetings and cruises.

Pat Antoni and her daughter Cindy Geske drove up from Florida to attend the D20 Spring Conference. Since moving down there several years ago, they joined Tampa Sail & Power Squadron and



now are officially transferring their membership to their new squadron. We are grateful for all their support and time to our education programs and rosters over many years!
