


## G. Tom Delahunty, SN

U. S. Power Squadrons awarded SVPS member Tom Delahunty his 50 year membership plaque and pin. He holds a full certificate and is a life member, with 33 merit marks. When Cdr Sidman and I delivered the award, Tom and his wife Millie treated us to a delicious gourmet meal in their Waterfront Dining Room. They moved into 'The Admiral at the Lake' retirement community when it opened in 2012. They have a beautiful high rise condominium overlooking Lake Michigan at Foster and Sheridan in Chicago. They love the location, which combines water views with city living (and public transportation).

Tom grew up around Illinois and Millie in the city of Chicago, which is where they met. They were married in 1954 shortly before Tom was drafted. Tom, a Chemical Engineer, went to law school and became an intellectual property attorney. They moved from Cincinnati to Long Island in 1964, where Tom also became a volunteer fireman. Millie had her own business. They have six children (two in New York, two in North Carolina, one in New Hampshire, and one in Wales) and thirteen grandchildren. Tom and Millie have moved eleven times. They moved back to Illinois in 2000, settling in Glenview until construction of The Admiral was completed in 2012. They lost several friends and former neighbors at the World Trade Center on 9/11/2001 not long after they left New York.

Tom and Millie are sail boaters. Tom built and fiberglassed their first boat in their back bedroom. Millie made the sails. They later purchased a Canadian Camper trailer boat. Their boat was called Alcyone, after a Greek demi goddess know as 'Queen who wards off storms'. They did most of their boating around Long Island and Fire Island. They joined the Sewanhaka Sail & Power Squadron in Long Island, where Tom became one of the youngest commanders in 1973. The squadron had 250 members when Tom was commander. At that time, women were not allowed to become USPS members, but were allowed to take USPS courses. There were so many squadrons close together in USPS District 3 that by attending each squadron's annual Change of Watch, they found themselves attending a formal USPS dinner dance almost every other weekend. They also enjoyed 'bareboating' with friends in the Virgin Islands. After Tom retired and moved back to Illinois. he would crew on his friend's 28 foot sailboat at Belmont Harbor, until the boat was sold a few years ago.

### YOUR WEATHER REPORT

### **Weather Update**

As I write this article, I notice how interesting and alarming to see how sudden weather changes can be so disastrous. A year ago, Texas was experiencing a drought. Today they have more water than they can handle. The change in the jet stream allowed more water to move north over Texas. In the short term it causes considerable damage, but in the long term it can restore Texas to a normal condition.

If we look west to California, they have been dry so long there were concerns that much of the area was going to become a desert because of all the wild fires. Then they received so much rain that the dried out hills became mud. And this mud caused much damage by destroying homes and roads. Unfortunately, the heavy rain came so fast it did little to help their drought conditions.

If we look to the east, South Carolina especially has seen so much rain that homes and roads are destroyed. This area was neither dry nor too wet before the rains came. Unfortunately, too much of



anything can burden the areas ability to deal with a problem. As of this writing, I believe some of the areas roads and bridges are gone and will take time to replace.

As we look over the rest of this country, most areas are either too dry or too wet. If these conditions continue for an extended period, we may see irreversible changes in our economy and the way we do things.

### OUR GREAT LAKES, OUR GREATEST RESOURCE

The easiest way to remember the names of the Great Lakes' names is to think of the word, "HOMES." H(uron), O(ntario), M(ichigan), E(rie) and S(uperior).

States and Canada.

Because of their vast size and depth, the Great Lakes exert significant effects on the region's weather. In winter, winds blowing over the lakes can generate heavy "lake-effect" snowstorms over shore areas. In 1954, the lakes even helped rev up Hurricane Hazel after the storm made landfall, leading to massive destruction in the Mid-Atlantic

Chicago's nickname as "The Windy City" might not have come from its lake breezes. Another theory attributes the name to the town's loud-mouthed politicians. Still, Lake Michigan and the other Great Lakes offer huge wind-energy potential. A 2004 study estimated the region's wind-power potential at 359 gigawatts of energy, or 80 percent of all the fossil fuel-based electricity currently generated in both the U.S. and Canada.

# Saint-Mathieu Lighthouse Plougonvelin, Finistere, France

Coordinates 48°19" 48" N 4° 46" 15" W

If you were to look at a map of France, you would see that northern territory of Brittany sticks out into the Atlantic Ocean. This point is an extremely important strategic location of this coast that is surrounded by cliffs.

You can see in this photo that part of the remains of an old Abbey of St. Mathieu is on the grounds. The lighthouse was built on the grounds of the ruined Abbey.

The Monks that lived in the Abbey used to keep a fire burning in a solid secondary tower to warn away vessels. Interestingly the Monks were allowed to keep the salvage of wrecked ships. I guess they felt the Monks were honest and would not compromise the ships.

There had long been a light signal for navigating ships before the Saint-Mathieu lighthouse. The end of the 17th century, however, brought with it a need for accessibility to a new naval base in Brest and the necessity of more serious methods of navigation for western Brittany.



The state of the tower of the ancient abbey was deteriorating, and a new lighthouse was put in service on 15 June 1835. The new lighthouse had a drum with an internal diameter

of 10 feet, and an external diameter of 118 feet, the base of which was surrounded by a circular building containing various shops and the guards' quarters. An internal staircase leads to sixteen half -lenses placed 180 feet above sea level, which were protected by a glass border of 32 inches, 9 0.35 inches thick. Of course I climbed it for a beautiful view.

# Extra Boat Show Volunteers Needed

USPS will have a Boating Skills Virtual Trainer (VT) simulator at the Chicago Boat, RV & Strictly Sail Show, scheduled 14-18 January 2016. We expect this will draw a lot of attention and more visitors to the USPS booth this year, so the Boat Show Committee is asking for extra volunteers.

The Boating Skills simulator is an award winning training unit that allows students to practice maneuvering a boat on an open lake, docking and other exercises. It is very realistic with three large 3D monitors, steering wheel and throttle. In fact, the Boating Skills VT simulator received the 2015 Innovations Award from NASBLA.

In all, USPS has 18 Boating Skills simulators developed through a grant from the U.S. Coast Guard. Working with the National Marine Mfg Association, simulators are being shipped to major boat shows across the country. USPS is the only organization that has a simulator for public demonstration, and it will be advertised by the show, drawing many visitors to our booth.



#### The Boat Skills VT includes:

- ☑ Three 20" monitors
- ☑ Boating console has a steering wheel and Mercury Marine throttle with trim buttons, navigation lights and horn
- ☑ Ability to change wind and current conditions, as well choosing day or night scenes


