### YOUR WEATHER REPORT

### **Atmospheric Pressure**

When we listen to the weather, they are always talking about the pressure. Depending on who you are receiving your information from, the pressure could be given to you in inches or millibars. Millibars is the more scientific terminology, but there is nothing wrong with using inches.

The pressure is measured with the use of a barometer. The exact measurement of the pressure is usually not nearly as important as the direction of the pressure. A falling pressure indicates that a low-pressure system is moving in or that a high-pressure system is moving away. An increasing pressure indicates that a high-pressure system is moving in or a low-pressure system is moving away. This is important because a high-pressure system is an indication of fair, cooler and dry weather. A low-pressure system is an indication of warmer and more humid weather. All storms (rain, tornadoes and hurricanes) are a product of a low-pressure system. The closer you get to the

center of a low-pressure system, the more severe the

storm.

Lines of equal pressure (isobars) shown on a weather map give you an indication of the strength of the winds. The closer the isobars are, the windier it will be. Conversely, the further apart the isobars are, the less wind there will be.

So, the next time you look at a weather map or listen to a weather report, pay attention to the atmospheric pressure. It just may be telling you something you need to know.

### OUR GREAT LAKES, OUR GREATEST RESOURCE

One of the presentations at the recent D20 Conference referenced Bubbly Creek. This section of the Chicago River south of downtown was a dumping ground for Chicago's meatpacking industry. In his 1906 novel called "The Jungle", Upton Sinclair described it as a

"great open sewer". It was so filthy, a person could walk on the floating stockyard waste without sinking in the water.


Although the river looks much better today, the remains of millions of animal carcasses are still decomposing at the bottom. The methane gas that is periodically released gives the river its notorious name: Bubbly Creek.

The US Army Corp of Engineers have a plan to restore the ecosystem for an estimated \$15 million. They would create a new natural bottom for the creek, essentially capping the decaying sludge with fresh sand and gravel, and placing native plants in the sediment to hold the new creek bed in place.

Sadly, their plans are on hold because if they touch it, the EPA would hold them liable for any contamination there, even if it was deposited many years ago. If the USACE can come to an agreement with the EPA to absolve them of potential liability, in 2023 they may be able to start reversing the mistakes of the past.

It's hard to believe we have to say goodbye. This was a picture of George and Bridget at our impromptu dinner outing in September.




