AN OLD, OLD FRIEND by Stuart Zwang

I have an old friend in my study. I look at it almost daily, and think about what it represents. It reminds me that any person who boats will sooner or later make a mistake. It might be small, large, expensive, foolish, or funny. In fact the only way that a mistake of this ilk will not happen is if you do not own or operate a boat. No matter how safe, courteous or cautious you are, you don't know when you will get an opportunity, as a boater, to take a swim, run aground, run out of fuel, dock in a unique or unusual manner or anchor incorrectly or end up in the wrong location.

This old pal makes me humble. It was 'born' in the early 1960's. It idolizes, memorializes and formalizes the exploits of so many of our predecessors and contemporaries. It seems like a who's who of the Skokie Valley Power Squadron. (or America's Boating Club North Shore we call ourselves today). My friend reminds me of camaraderie, laughs, good people and good times. Frankly this friend sometimes makes me sad as well, because it reminds me of many of the individuals who are no longer with us.

My friend has an interesting shape as well. It is about ten inches (10") wide by eight inches (8") tall. The face of my friend has a tattoo of our burgee on its upper left hand quadrant. It has a very unique feature that every canine wants to grasp with their snout. The lower left quadrant of this snout starts about an inch and a half (1-1/2") above and to the right of the lower left hand corner. It then rises for eight inches (8") at an angle of about 25 degrees towards the upper right side of my friend. It has two tendrils coming down – one on the left, and one on the right. Each tendril is a little longer than two feet (2')

Have you figured out who my old friend is yet? Other squadrons have old friends like this as well. Another squadron that I know of calls it the 'Bent Prop Award.' Of course we call my friend the "Boner Award." My long suffering wife expresses her reservations about what an idiot I have been to 'earn' it.

Ken Bluett, a gentleman that I never met was the first recipient in 1964.

My name graces this award first for my 2015 exploit with Gary Vinzant when we were helping out as the chase boats at the Crystal Lake Rowing Club Invitational. We anchored my boat at the finish line, and came in for lunch on Gary's boat. After lunch we left the pier on Gary's boat. The problem was that Gary is such an excellent mechanic that his spring commissioning, his reverse gear wouldn't. So I got out and pushed. Unsurprisingly, when I tried to jump into his boat, I missed. Fortunately I was wearing swim clothes, so after an hour of grumping, I was dry.

Incidentally and perhaps fittingly, Gary won the award on his own for both 2014 and 2016. That was his third. I am sure that he will be more than happy to explain this to you the next time you see him. In 2020 my wife and I volunteered as boat escorts for the tall ships pageant in Kenosha WI. I won the award for not one item, but for a number of exploits that kept recurring. You can read all about this in a prior issue of Running Lights.

For the record, Bud Lemke is the all-time record recipient of this award (five times).

I was told that any person in the Skokie Valley Squadron who has a boat has at least a 15% chance to earn the boner award. The reason for that is we have fewer and fewer members who actively own and operate boats. Although one of my recent Running Lights article again puts me in the running for the award, I am given to understand that after a fourteen year hiatus, it appears that Joe Lokaj nominated himself for 2021.

You will have to come to the Change of Watch to find out who is this year's recipient. In the meantime, I want to wish each and every one of you, a New Year that is blessed with peace and happiness.

SIX BASIC STEPS IN A CREW-OVERBOARD SITUATION

- 1. Get buoyancy to the victim.
- 2. Slow the boat.
- Assign a crew member to keep the victim in sight at all times.
- 4. Return to the victim (downwind).
- 5. Connect the victim to the boat.
- 6. Recover the victim.

In most circumstances, a crew-overboard situation is not life-threatening if handled properly. Drills should be conducted regularly and above all _____should prevail throughout the recovery.
