A MESSAGE FROM OUR COMMANDER

YOUR WEATHER REPORT

Floods

In the last year there has been devastating damage around the world due to storms of all kinds, with the end result being floods. Regardless of the type of storm, the greatest amount of damage is usually due to water damage. When one says the probability of a flood occurring every 100 years, what they are really saying is a 1% chance of it happening in any given year.

Flash floods are particularly dangerous because they can happen so quickly. Generally they are caused by heavy rainfall resulting from slow moving thunderstorms or rains from hurricanes and tropical storms. Flash floods move at high speeds giving them the power to move boulders, tear out trees, and destroy buildings and bridges. Rapidly rising waters can reach 20 or more feet and carry dangerous debris.

The National Weather Service advises the public to:

- ☑ Go to higher ground if flooding occurs;
- ☑ Get out of areas subject to flooding (dips, low spots, canyons, etc.);
- ✓ Never attempt to cross flowing streams and never allow water to get above knee level;
- ✓ Never camp or park along streams or washes when flood conditions threaten:
- ✓ Never drive through flooded water, cars can float in two feet of water;
- ☑ Be especially cautious at night when recognizing danger is more difficult.

Eight ways to use less plastic...

- 1. Skip the bottled water and use a reusable water bottle.
- 2. Avoid using a straw. Straws are one of the top 10 marine debris items found on beaches.
- 3. Avoid using microbeads found in face washes and tooth pastes. Check labels for "poly".
- 4. Buy products made from recycled materials with little or no packaging.
- 5. Choose to carry reusable bags for shopping.
- 6. Repair, upgrade or turn in electronics to recycle.
- 7. Wear clothing made of non-synthetic fibers. Polyester clothing is made of plastic.
- 8. Compost and use fewer garbage bags.

PRE-TRAILERING CHECKLIST

- Remove or stow loose items that might blow out of the boat.
- Secure anchors, batteries, and coolers so they won't slide around.
- Tie canvas tops or covers tightly to keep them from ripping in the wind.
- Make sure that all tie-downs are securely fastened.
- Check trailer tail lights, stop lights, turn signals, and tire pressure.
- Make sure the hitch is seated and locked, and that the safety chains are run under the trailer tongue.

News from National...

In February, 22 members from District 20 attended the USPS annual meeting in Orlando Florida, including Pat Antoni, Cindy Geske, Frank and Karen D'Amico from Skokie Valley. The 85 degree weather was a nice break from our snowy February. Frank and I went ear-



ly to join one of the tours on Wednesday to the Kennedy Space Center and see the Atlantis Shuttle exhibit.

On Thursday, there were open meetings and presentations by each of the National Departments and Friday there were 20 different seminars hosted throughout the day by several of the National Committees. Thursday evening, Caren Canfield from Rockford Squadron received her 25 year life membership. Saturday during the Governing Board Meeting, Bill Schwartz who is also from Rockford received his 50 Year Emeritus Award (for 50 merit marks), which means he is now permanently a voting member of the Governing Board.

There was a lot of information about the new America's Boating Club branding effort. The national marketing campaign began in January. You may have already started to see print and digital ads in publications such as Boat US, Boating, Great Lakes Scuttlebutt, Marina Life, Sail, or The Fisherman (just to name a few). Initially, the goal of these ads is to build awareness that USPS is America's Boating Club. Later this year, the digital and social ads will transition to a "call to action", such as joining or taking a course. The National Marketing Committee recently published a detailed guidebook on using the new branding. Frank and I will provide information about the campaign and how to leverage the new trademarks to recruit members at the D20 Spring Conference on Saturday morning (3/17).

In the spirit of updating our image with the boating public, several of the advanced grade member courses are being renamed. Seamanship will be called Boat Handling, Piloting will be Marine Navigation, AP will be Advanced Marine Navigation, JN will be called Offshore Navigation, and N will be called Celestial Navigation. The hope is the new names will help the boating public better understand and relate to the content of our courses. However, members will still keep the existing grade designations (S, P, AP, JN, N and SN).

Saturday, the Governing Board passed a bylaws change allowing the District Commander and National XO to authorize a waiver for a struggling squadron who wants to alter the operational structure and prevent them from dissolving. This provides the flexibility to meet requirements of the National Bylaws and the opportunity for a squadron to rebuild.

Lastly, the new USPS Endowment Fund Inc. was established in September. This is a 501(c)(3) organization setup for planned giving. This type of organization is more favorable for estate planning than the existing endowment fund trust. All gifts are invested and only the proceeds are used to fund activities for USPS. Thanks to a recent 7-figure donation, the balance in this fund is already \$1.9 million.
