A MESSAGE FROM OUR COMMANDER

have been pretty busy lately. On any given day, I have at least one or two Zoom meetings. The Skokie Valley Executive Committee meets on Zoom. We did our Change of Watch on Zoom. I am also our webmaster and webmaster for District 20, as well as incoming Assistant District Education Officer. Every other week I am in a GoToMeeting conference with the USPS ITCOM committee. My job in that group is to plan a new model for web sites for all squadrons based on the Joomla system we now use for SVPS. I am the Communications Officer and webmaster for the Lake County Squadron of the Civil Air Patrol, a U.S. Air Force Auxiliary. Then there is my ham radio hobby, where I am the Education Director for the North Shore Radio Club, where I teach classes in radio and electronics and give FCC license exams, all by Zoom. I am a VP of Congregation B'nai Tikvah, my synagogue, where daily services, education programs, lectures, and fellowship events are on Zoom.



The Illinois stay at home order allows for boating to begin on May 1st, but limited to two people regardless of the relationship. North Point Marina is listed as one of the state park facilities to open. The Chain of Lakes is closed in parts due to flooding.

Wisconsin and Indiana facilities are open for business. Southport Marina for example is taking a few extra precautions, like closing the office to foot traffic or limiting access to the storage facilities unless you are scheduled to launch in the next two weeks.

Here are a few precautions to take this season:

- Limit the people aboard to those family members you share your home with—no guests.
- Avoid rafting up with other boats or pulling up onto a beach next to another boat, as that could put you in close proximity with the occupants.
- Maintain a safe distance from others when loading up at the marina or fueling the boat.
- Disinfect by washing your hands or using a hand sanitizer after doing anything that requires touching an item someone else may have touched, like a marina gate lock or a fuel pump.
- Pack your gear and supplies ahead of time and don't plan to stop at a store on the way to the marina or launch ramp.

The Bermuda Triangle

We have all heard about the Bermuda Triangle and all the ships and planes that have been lost in this area with no trace or survivors. Science has not been able to confirm how any of these disappearances occurred. The fact that these planes and ships disappear with no trace leaves anyone to be confused.

There are many theories as to what happened, but no one really knows. Some interesting ideas are water spouts (tornado over water), violent weather, massive waves, spatial disorientation, the strong

gulf stream, and hurricane alley. Not to be forgotten some of the deepest areas of the ocean are within the triangle.

Perhaps some of these are causes for the missing craft, but why are there no debris? One of the best theories in my mind is that whatever causes these craft to go down, the swift gulf stream moves everything much further North than where people think they should be. And if they ever do come ashore, no one associates them to the missing craft.

There is a lot of material on this subject, but no one can come up with a single theory to explain the missing crafts. That is probably because there is not one to be found, but many.



OUR GREAT LAKES, OUR GREATEST RESOURCE


With everyone spending more time at home, here are a few ideas to conserve one of our scarce resources...our water.

The EPA estimates the average US household wastes nearly 10,000 gallons of water every year. That's enough to fill a residential-sized swimming pool. Here are some things you can do...

- 1. Eat less beef. One pound of beef requires 1,800 gallons of water to produce, according to the Water Footprint Network.
- 2. Reuse leftover cooking water. Save the water used to boil pasta or vegetables and use it to water your plants or garden. They will love the extra nutrients in the water.
- 3. Replace your showerhead. Install a low-flow rain shower that provides great pressure for washing and uses less water.
- 4. Try a waterless facial cleanser. Rinse free cleansers use just a few drops on a cotton pad; swipe across your skin and you are done. No water necessary.
- 5. Invest in a reusable water bottle. There is a growing problem of plastic pollution in our water supply. How many plastic bottles do you use each year?
