A MESSAGE FROM OUR COMMANDER

S eptember turned out to be a busy month for us. We have a new member, Bob Leighton, of Lake in the Hills. He has a 36' sailboat, wants to cruise the Great Lakes with it, and is an engineer by trade. We need sailors who can help teach the Sail course and enlighten us with their long cruises. Many thanks to Tony Palazzo for encouraging his Southport neighbor to join our organization.

I got to see many sailboats in harbors in Greece. During my one week tour there with Bonni, we visited islands like Poros and Hydra, saw ruins from the ancient and classical periods, visited many museums, attended lectures, and ate great Mediterranean food. Of course that included the Parthenon and an amphitheater with perfect acoustics built ten centuries B.C.E.

That trip unfortunately collided with the Governing Board and our September dinner meeting. Pat Antoni reports that the Governing Board in Louisville, KY will be the last one, ever. A restructuring plan was passed and will go to the membership for ratification. As a result, the ranks and titles will disappear. No more Commanders, Executive or Administrative officers, just a president, secretary-treasurer, and an education coordinator. The objective is to dump the paramilitary features of America's Boating Club and make it fit the needs of the younger generations we seem unable to recruit. More virtual online classes, electronic communication, and casual dress will be the new order of the day. Say what you will, the old Operations Training Manual is just not working any longer.

Tony Palazzo reported that the dinner meeting at the Club Casa Café was a big hit. The food got rave reviews, and the restaurant did not penalize us for having fewer than our guaranteed minimum attendees. Christine March had the new clothing from the Ship's Store with the ABC logotypes, and it was a good place to go with your fellow boaters.

We have our last ABC class scheduled for September 28 at Bay Marine. This time there are more than a few online signups and interested parties that contacted the marina and me for details.

The Fall District 20 Conference will take place October 25-26 at the Elgin Holiday Inn. We will host the Spring conference March 20-21 at the same venue. Both are well planned and shorter than in the past, so I hope we can attract more attendees.

The new roster is back from the printer and ready to mail. The picture on the cover is my boat, Bonni Jo, escorting the Tall Ships in the waters off Kenosha Harbor. The Coast Guard is alongside keeping an eye on my movements. I am honored.

It is time to haul out our boats and lay them up for the winter. One of the great reasons to belong to America's Boating Club is how well we keep the enthusiasm up through the winter with some great programs.

YOUR WEATHER REPORT

History of a Hurricane

As I am writing this article, Dorian is just off the Southeast Coast of the USA. I have been watching this storm since it was a tropical storm in the Atlantic Ocean. It moved Northwest across the Caribbean and became a category 1 Hurricane headed for Puerto Rico. It missed most of Puerto Rico and hit St. Thomas before heading for the USA mainland.

As it moved into warmer water, it got stronger and hit the Northern Bahamas as a Category 5 storm and then stopped over Grand Bahama and destroyed most of the buildings on the island. In addition to the strong winds of 185 mph with gusts of 220 mph, it rained continuously for 36 hours before moving more northerly as a category 2 and then category 3 about 100 miles off the coast of Florida and other southeastern states.

This movement off shore of the southern states caused large coastal flooding and severe rain, but the severely strong winds stayed off shore.

As this storm continues, it appears to be getting closer to the mainland and will probably clip the outer banks of North Carolina before heading more Northeast and out to sea into cooler water where it will slowly diminish into just another Atlantic storm.

Even though most of the USA mainland will only see flooding and minor property damage from this storm, it has caused many residents to evacuate their homes and businesses. Since it happened over the Labor Day weekend, many vacations and holidays were cut short or cancelled completely. The personal damage may be minor, the economic damage is major and cannot be recovered. Those who live in the Southeast will forever remember Dorian.





Twelve ways to conserve water:

- Limit your shower to 5 minutes and save 3,785 liters a month
- Turn the water off while you shampoo to 2. save 550 liters a week
- 3. Turn off the water while brushing your teeth and save up to 15 liters a minute
- Soak pots and pans instead of running water while scraping 4. them clean
- 5. Don't use running water to defrost food
- Use one glass for drinking water each day to reduce the 6. number of times you run the dishwasher
- Run your dishwasher only when it's full and save up to 7. 3,785 liters a month
- Collect rain water for watering your garden 8.
- 9. Plant in the spring or fall when water requirements are lower
- 10. Water your lawn in several short sessions to allow the water to be absorbed better
- 11. Upgrade appliances and toilets to be more water-efficient
- 12. Collect running water while waiting for it to get hot, and use it to water the plants

Seamanship COURSE **Education and Membership Drive Student Guide**

In an effort to recruit new members, the bridge has approved our offering a free class to any student who will enroll as a member of Skokie Valley.

We are starting the program with the ABC class scheduled for Saturday 28 September. And, we are also extending it to all new members you can recruit. Our plan is to offer the Boat Handling Course starting Thursday 17 October. This will be a 2-hour class held for 7 weeks at Lake Zurich Library: 6:30 to 8:30 pm.

The Boat Handling Course is a new and improved version of the old Seamanship Course. Much of the redundancy of the ABC3 course has been removed and it is set up as 6 individual seminars. The students can pick and choose which of the 6 seminars they want to take and if they pass the final exam, they will receive the grade of Seamanship (S).

A review will be presented on the 6th week and the final exam will be held on the 7th week. If may be shorter if the students decide to just test out on any of the seminars.

The cost of this course is \$75 to members and \$125 to non members. The course material will be presented as an e-book. There will be an additional charge of \$15 should the student prefer a printed manual. The cost of membership is \$99 for a single person and \$148.50 for a family.


